## School of Law

The faculty development program we work with has placed students from underrepresented groups as junior faculty at multiple law schools across the country, including one of my students who just accepted a position as Assistant Professor at Harvard Law School (and also had offers from Columbia, NYU, Chicago and elsewhere).

The <u>Racial Justice Center</u> has already begun a series of research and policy reform projects, with a wide range of external partners, including:

- the African American Mayors Association
- Public Counsel (one of the major and largest public interest law firms in the United States)
- IntegrateNYC (a grassroots community group that aims to integrate NYC schools on the basis of race and class)
- Gibson, Dunn and Crutcher (a leading law firm)

Other Racial Justice Center projects under development--including the <u>Innovate Alabama Project</u> that Condi Rice is leading, and a major project at the intersection of racial equity and business, which the Ford Foundation has expressed interest in funding.
